MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Under direction of the Deputy Chief of Design, serve as the liaison to the Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) and State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). Manage all aspects of LPC and SHPO interface including Parks project submissions, archaeology issues, environmental reviews and proposed landmark designations and listings.
- Provide technical design guidance to Parks staff on LPC submissions throughout the design process to ensure agency standards are met. Coordinate submissions and participate in public hearings, as necessary. Respond to comments and questions and keep internal records.
- Serve as Parks preservation liaison, interfacing with elected officials and local historic preservation groups, providing expert advice and gaining support and approval for projects.
- Develop a library of best practice designs and submissions for various types of work on historically important properties.
- Promote preservation practices and implement restoration programs for New York City parks properties.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A valid New York State Registration as an Architect and four years of full-time architectural experience. A master's degree in architecture from an accredited college will be accepted as equivalent to one year of full-time architectural experience.
- 2. In addition to above qualification requirements, to be eligible for placement in Assignment Levels II and III, individuals must have at least one year within the last three years of experience as a major contributor or a project leader on a complex project requiring additional and specific expertise in the disciplines needed to design or construct the project.

This position is exempt from NYC residency requirements.
