24-Hour Construction at Staten Island Beaches

WORKING THROUGH THE NIGHT AND EARLY MORNING HOURS

UPDATED THURSDAY, JUNE 20th – This month, the Parks Department and the Department of Design and Construction **expect to deliver new, factory-built comfort and lifeguard stations and other beach facilities to Wolfe’s Pond, Midland Beach, and Cedar Grove during the overnight hours** – the only time we can move these large and heavy structures through the streets. This work will be done in coordination with multiple agencies. The new buildings will be transported on large trucks with escorts.

Once the buildings are delivered, cranes will be waiting to lift them into place atop the beach piles that were installed in recent weeks. Contractors will then secure the buildings to the piles and connect utilities.

The schedule below is subject to change based on weather and other unforeseen conditions. We will notify the community as quickly as possible in the event of schedule changes.

What can I expect?

During the delivery and connection of the beach facilities and lifeguard and comfort stations, you will likely hear diesel truck engines, crane activity, and ‘beeping’ from trucks backing up. You may also hear safety horns during emergency situations.

Once the buildings are installed, work will continue at each site until the project is completed. This work will be significantly quieter than pile driving operations – but you may still hear construction activities at any time during the day or night.

We ask for your patience and understanding as we complete these vital projects to restore our City’s beaches following the devastation caused by Superstorm Sandy.

Could there be any changes to the schedule?

Though we will do everything we can to adhere to the schedule listed on the preceding page, deliveries of these large buildings can be delayed by high winds and other inclement weather, traffic, mechanical failures, and other unforeseen conditions. We will provide updates to the community in the event of significant schedule changes.
