**Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed
Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain**

To: All interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

This is to give notice that the City of New York is proposing to undertake activities within the 100-year floodplain relating to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program. President Obama signed the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2) into law on January 29, 2013. Among other appropriations, the Act included \$16 billion in CDBG-DR funds for "necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from Hurricane Sandy. Pursuant to 24 CFR Part 58, the City, as the subrecipient of the grant funds, has identified its Office of Management and Budget (OMB) as the Responsible Entity for maintaining the CDBG-DR Environmental Review Record. This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order (EO) 11988 for Floodplain Management, and by Section 2(b) of EO 11990 for the Protection of Wetlands, and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20(b) for the HUD action that is within and/or affects a floodplain or wetland. Under the CDBG-DR program, the City will undertake the reconstruction of the Rockaways boardwalk in Queens, New York within the 100-year floodplain.

In the Rockaways, Hurricane Sandy damaged approximately 4.7 miles of boardwalk. Targeted repairs were made to portions of this boardwalk in time to allow its limited use during the summer of 2013. The City now proposes to make permanent repairs that would increase the resiliency of the boardwalk from Beach 20th Street to Beach 126th Street. It is the intention of the project to reconstruct the boardwalk on the original concrete foundations (also referred to as "bents") and to rebuild all boardwalk areas generally to the typical boardwalk width of 40 feet. Further, the project proposes to raise the new boardwalk to an elevation above the 100-year FEMA storm surge levels that vary along the site from +13 feet to +17 feet North American Vertical Datum of 1988. The typical boardwalk surface would be designed to be 3.0 feet above the 100-year storm surge elevation, raising the new boardwalk sections from approximately 1.4 feet at the eastern portion of the site to approximately 8.0 feet to the west.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

All interested persons, groups, and agencies are invited to submit written comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support the reconstruction of the Rockaways boardwalk in a floodplain. Written comments should be sent to OMB at 255 Greenwich Street, 8th Floor, New York, New York 10007, Attention: Calvin Johnson, Assistant Director CDBG-DR or via email at CDBGDR-enviro@omb.nyc.gov. The minimum 15 calendar day comment period will begin the day after publication and end on the 16th day after publication. Such comments should be received by OMB on or before October 6, 2013.

9/11 MEMORIAL

The Lower Manhattan Development Corporation (LMDC) has allocated funds to the City of New York and the National September 11 Memorial & Museum to address a range of transportation improvements that will benefit commuters, businesses, residents and pedestrians in Lower Manhattan. These funds are intended to accomplish one or more of the following:

- Improve mobility
- Improve connectivity between Lower Manhattan, the rest of New York City and the region
- Promote the livability of Lower Manhattan, and/or encourage business development
- Improve conditions for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Promote use of public transportation
- Reduce congestion on the streets
- Support traffic management and emergency response
- Ease the impact of construction on residents, businesses and tourists
- Provide access to the streets for vehicular traffic

The City of New York and the National September 11 Memorial & Museum are seeking public comment regarding the use of \$4 million of these funds to construct sidewalks connecting the National September 11 Memorial Plaza at the World Trade Center to New York State Route 9A, the roadway adjacent to the World Trade Center Site on its western side. The proposed project is further described below.

This proposed allocation is open to public comment for 30 calendar days from the date of publication of this project description. Comment must be made in writing and may be delivered to the National September 11 Memorial & Museum either by posted mail or by electronic submission as follows:

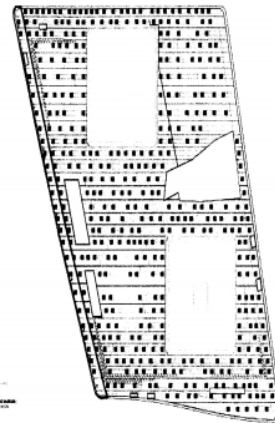

The deadline for receipt of public comments is September 26, 2013 at 5:00 P.M. Comments delivered by fax or telephone will not be considered.

The National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center (9/11 Memorial) will provide \$4 million of LMDC transportation funding for the completion of the western sidewalk that connects the Memorial plaza to Route 9A (shown below).



As the LMDC envisioned through the Memorial Jury's selection of the "Reflecting Absence" design, the Memorial is intended to have a "curb to curb" design, integrating this sacred place of remembrance into the city surrounding it. The sidewalk design on all four sides of the Memorial includes the same white oak trees that grace the plaza and features many of the same key design elements as the rest of the Memorial. Constructing the sidewalks as designed helps to complete the Memorial and fulfill a fundamental aspect of Studio Daniel Libeskind's master plan for the rebuilt World Trade Center site, which always envisioned that the Memorial at its heart would transition seamlessly into the areas around it.

To ensure the integrity of the design of the Memorial and the World Trade Center as a whole, the Route 9A sidewalk, which is the property of the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT), requires additional resources to match the other three sidewalks.

In addition to ensuring the Memorial's curb-to-curb design, this work will help complete construction along Route 9A and the World Trade Center, improve pedestrian pathways, and increase access to the Memorial and the entire World Trade Center.

Project Description

The Memorial's west side sidewalk is approximately 25-foot wide and extends north from Liberty Street to Fulton Street. Specific design elements included to continue the Memorial design to the curb are as follows:

- Verde fontaine granite curb
- Verde fontaine granite bollard band
- K-12-rated bollards and footings
- Structural soil organic mix
- Irrigation/aeration system, concrete base
- Steel plates over trees
- Verde fontaine cobblestones
- Verde fontaine pavers
- Steel trench drains
- Fully matured swamp white oak trees to match the trees on the Memorial.

The standard NYSDOT sidewalk design (25-foot wide) for the 9A corridor on West Street includes the following: granite curb, granite pavers, non-rated bollards, structural soil, concrete slab, and small trees in a cobblestone bed.

This is to give notice that the City of New York is proposing to undertake activities within the 100-year floodplain relating to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program. President Obama signed the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2) into law on January 29, 2013. Among other appropriations, the Act included \$16 billion in CDBG-DR funds for "necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from Hurricane Sandy. Pursuant to 24 CFR Part 58, the City, as the subrecipient of the grant funds, has identified its Office of Management and Budget (OMB) as the Responsible Entity for maintaining the CDBG-DR Environmental Review Record. This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order (EO) 11988 for Floodplain Management, and by Section 2(b) of EO 11990 for the Protection of Wetlands, and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20(b) for the HUD action that is within and/or affects a floodplain or wetland. Under the CDBG-DR program, the City will undertake the reconstruction of the Rockaways boardwalk in Queens, New York within the 100-year floodplain.

In the Rockaways, Hurricane Sandy damaged approximately 4.7 miles of boardwalk. Targeted repairs were made to portions of this boardwalk in time to allow its limited use during the summer of 2013. The City now proposes to make permanent repairs that would increase the resiliency of the boardwalk from Beach 20th Street to Beach 126th Street. It is the intention of the project to reconstruct the boardwalk on the original concrete foundations (also referred to as "bents") and to rebuild all boardwalk areas generally to the typical boardwalk width of 40 feet. Further, the project proposes to raise the new boardwalk to an elevation above the 100-year FEMA storm surge levels that vary along the site from +13 feet to +17 feet North American Vertical Datum of 1988. The typical boardwalk surface would be designed to be 3.0 feet above the 100-year storm surge elevation, raising the new boardwalk sections from approximately 1.4 feet at the eastern portion of the site to approximately 8.0 feet to the west.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

This is to give notice that the City of New York is proposing to undertake activities within the 100-year floodplain relating to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program. President Obama signed the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2) into law on January 29, 2013. Among other appropriations, the Act included \$16 billion in CDBG-DR funds for "necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from Hurricane Sandy. Pursuant to 24 CFR Part 58, the City, as the subrecipient of the grant funds, has identified its Office of Management and Budget (OMB) as the Responsible Entity for maintaining the CDBG-DR Environmental Review Record. This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order (EO) 11988 for Floodplain Management, and by Section 2(b) of EO 11990 for the Protection of Wetlands, and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20(b) for the HUD action that is within and/or affects a floodplain or wetland. Under the CDBG-DR program, the City will undertake the reconstruction of the Rockaways boardwalk in Queens, New York within the 100-year floodplain.

In the Rockaways, Hurricane Sandy damaged approximately 4.7 miles of boardwalk. Targeted repairs were made to portions of this boardwalk in time to allow its limited use during the summer of 2013. The City now proposes to make permanent repairs that would increase the resiliency of the boardwalk from Beach 20th Street to Beach 126th Street. It is the intention of the project to reconstruct the boardwalk on the original concrete foundations (also referred to as "bents") and to rebuild all boardwalk areas generally to the typical boardwalk width of 40 feet. Further, the project proposes to raise the new boardwalk to an elevation above the 100-year FEMA storm surge levels that vary along the site from +13 feet to +17 feet North American Vertical Datum of 1988. The typical boardwalk surface would be designed to be 3.0 feet above the 100-year storm surge elevation, raising the new boardwalk sections from approximately 1.4 feet at the eastern portion of the site to approximately 8.0 feet to the west.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

All interested persons, groups, and agencies are invited to submit written comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support the reconstruction of the Rockaways boardwalk in a floodplain. Written comments should be sent to OMB at 255 Greenwich Street, 8th Floor, New York, New York 10007. Attention: Calvin Johnson, Assistant Director CDBG-DR or via email at CDBGDR-enviro@omb.nyc.gov. The minimum 15 calendar day comment period will begin the day after publication and end on the 16th day after publication. Such comments should be received by OMB on or before October 6, 2013.

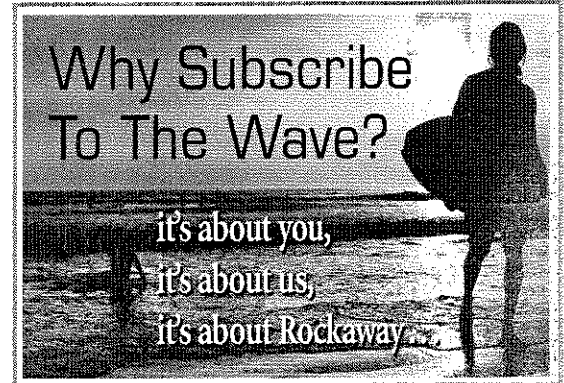
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


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

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БРОНКС СТРАДАЕТ ОТ НАСИЛИЯ

Недавние выходные оказались в этом боро на редкость кровавыми: 7 человек получили ранения, 1 убит. При этом статистика показывает, что количество преступлений, связанных с применением оружия, резко сократилось.

Пока, как сообщила полиция, в боро было зафиксировано 55 убийств, за аналогичный же период прошлого года их было на 22 больше. Количество перестрелок за первые 8 месяцев снизилось с 293 в 2012 году до 201.



«Этот год для Бронкса - исторический, — с гордостью заявил заместитель инспектора Расселл Грин, командир 43-го участка. — Во многих районах отмечается подобное уменьшение показателей».

На прошедшей недавно встрече с советом общности этого участка Грин отметил, что такие достижения стали возможны благодаря более активному участию руководства в оперативной работе и усилению патрулирования — прежде всего, внимание уделяют проблемным районам, где ранее было отмечено больше, чем в других, преступлений, связанных с насилием.

Его коллеги также не сидят, сложа руки. На территории 40-го участка, включающего районы Mott Haven и Port Morris, количество убийств за 8 месяцев сократилось с 9 в 2012 году до 7 в 2013-м, а перестрелок — на 47%.

В настоящее время, по официальной информации, перестрелок стало на 76% меньше, чем 20 лет назад. Поэтому боро действительно становится более безопасным, и местные жители подтверждают этот факт. «Ситуация меняется к лучшему, когда полицейские активно патрулируют улицы, следят за обстановкой, общаются с местными жителями», — подчеркнул, в частности, преподобный Сидни Харгрейв, проживающий в районе Soundview, на территории 43-го участка.

Ведь именно по окончании этого состязания он одобрил план стоимостью \$500 млн, разрешающий Американской теннисной ассоциации (USTA) расширить свое присутствие в Flushing Meadows-Corona Park.

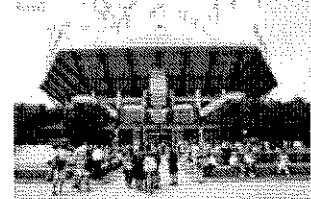
План предусматривает снос старых площадок и строительство двух стадионов — на 8 и 15 тысяч мест, где будут проходить крупные теннисные турниры, а также двух паркингов. В июле городской совет почти единогласно одобрил этот проект, узнав, что USTA выделила на нужды района Flushing Meadows \$10 млн. Правда, уверенность, что строительство может нанести вред парковой зоне, остались.

«Позор, что выбранные горожанами представители торгуют нашими интересами и готовы пожертвовать зелеными насаждениями в обмен на деньги, которые

району, в принципе, должно было предоставить правительство, — отметил, в частности, Альфредо Сентола, активист инициативной группы Save Flushing Meadows-Corona Park. — Ведь это они, а не частный бизнес, должны финансировать муниципальные парки».

Но, судя по всему, защитники парка смирились, что им не удастся отстоять свою правоту. Все, что в их силах, они уже сделали, и теперь вынуждены лишь сокращаться. К примеру, президентка организации New York City Park Advocates Джеффри Крофта, давнего противника того, чтобы территория, отданная USTA, была расширена, возмущает то, что проект был в итоге одобрен. Но и он признает, что не может вопрепятствовать его реализации.

Аппетиты же теннисной ассоциации все растут. В настоящее время она арендует у города 46 акров. Подписанный же Куомо проект предусматривает увеличение территории еще на акр за счет парковой зоны.



МРАЧНЫЕ ПРОГНОЗЫ

работали или учились в Нижнем Манхэттене, заболели раком.

Однако это лишь верхушка айсберга. На самом деле, жертв может быть значительно больше, потому что эксперты учитывают только пациентов, которые участвуют в государственных программах, а многие лечатся у частных врачей, замечает доктор Джим Мелиус, глава комиссии WTC Responder Medical Program, а рак — коварное заболевание, которое может проявиться не сразу.

Всем заинтересованным агентствам, организациям и частным лицам Извещаем, что власти Нью-Йорк-Сити предлагают осуществлять деятельность в затопляемой зоне в соответствии с программой Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) министерства жилья и городского развития США (HUD). Президент Обама 29 января 2013 года подписал Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013 (Public Law 113-2). Среди прочего, закон предусматривает выделение \$16 млрд. в рамках CDBG-DR на необходимые расходы, связанные с помощью пострадавшим, долгосрочным восстановлением, воссозданием инфраструктуры и жилья и экономическим стимулированием районов, понесших наибольший ущерб от урагана «Сэнди». В соответствии с 24 CFR Part 58, город как субполучатель грантов возложил на Офис менеджмента и бюджета (OMB) обязанность ведения CDBG-DR Supplemental Review Record. Это извещение публикуется в Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order (EO) 13688 for Floodplain Management and Section 5(b) of EO 11990 for the Protection of Wetlands, а также правилами HUD, указанными в 24CFR 55.20(b) в отношении действий, проводимых в затопляемых зонах или водно-болотных угодьях либо влияющих на них. В рамках программы CDBG-DR город намеревается провести реконструкцию набережной в районе Rockaways, Квинс, в затопляемой зоне.

В Rockaways ураган «Сэнди» повредил примерно 4,7 мили набережной. Был проведен частичный ремонт, позволивший обеспечить ее ограниченное использование летом 2013 года. Сейчас город предлагает осуществить капитальный ремонт, который укрепит набережную на участке от Beach 20th Street до Beach 126th Street. Проект предусматривает перестройку набережной на ее изначальной бетонной основе и расширение на всем протяжении до 40 футов. Кроме того, предлагается увеличить ее высоту с 13 до 17 футов над уровнем, который, по данным FEMA, при ураганах подвергается затоплению. Как правило, высота набережной составляет 3 фута над этим уровнем, а после модернизации поверхность будет поднята на высоту в пределах от 1,4 фута в восточной части до 8 футов в западной.

Это извещение преследует 3 основные цели. Во-первых, люди, которые могут затронуть деятельность в затопляемой зоне и которые интересуются защитой окружающей среды, получают возможность высказать свои предложения и предоставить информацию. Во-вторых, программа оповещения общественности является важным способом обеспечения. Распространение информации о затопляемых зонах позволит повысить эффективность усилий, которые федеральные власти прилагают для снижения риска проживания и модификации этих зон. В-третьих, когда федеральное правительство осуществляет деятельность в затопляемых зонах, оно должно информировать тех, кто находится в зоне большого или сохраняющегося риска.

Приглашаем всех заинтересованных частных лиц, организации и агентства предоставить предложения об использовании федеральных фондов для финансирования реконструкции набережной в Rockaways в затопляемой зоне. 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

Rockaway Beach Boardwalk Reconstruction – Queens, NY

- Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Funds for the reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvements between Beach 9th and Beach 149th Streets in the borough of Queens, New York, Environmental Review Procedures for Entities Assuming HUD Environmental Responsibilities (pursuant to 24 CFR §58).
- Decision Process for E.O. 11988 as Provided by 24 CFR §55.20

Step 1: *Determine whether the action is located in a 100-year floodplain (or a 500-year floodplain for critical actions).*

The proposed project is located within the 100-year floodplain (area with a 1 percent chance of flooding each year). Based on the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) released on December 5, 2013, which represent the Best Available Flood Hazard Data (BAFHD), the project site falls within Zone VE, which is an area of high flood risk subject to inundation by the 1 percent annual-chance flood event, with additional hazards due to storm-induced velocity wave action (a 3-foot or higher breaking wave). The preliminary FIRM 100-year flood elevations along the project site range from +13 to +17 feet NAVD 88. Existing elevations of the tops of the pile caps for the boardwalk range from +10.4 to +14.56 feet NAVD 88. The project involves new construction within the floodplain and thus E.O. 19988 applies.

Hurricane Sandy severely damaged the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk in October 2012. The Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvement project involves the reconstruction of the boardwalk between Beach 20th and Beach 126th Streets, and reconstruction of this important community and regional resource would improve its future storm resiliency by raising the overall elevation to account for both revised 100-year flood elevations and predicted future sea level rise. Therefore, an evaluation of the project's effects on the floodplain will be evaluated.

Step 2: *Notify the public for early review of the proposal and involve the affected and interested public in the decision making process.*

A public notice describing the project was published in multiple papers and multiple languages on September 20, 2013. The ad targeted local residents, including those in the floodplain. Copies of the published notifications were kept in the project's environmental review records and are attached to this document. The required 15 calendar days were allowed for public comment. As required by regulation, the notice also included the name, proposed location and description of the activity, and the HUD official or responsible entity contact for information as well as the location and hours of the office at which a full description of the proposed action can be viewed.

No comments were received on the public floodplain notice.

Step 3: *Identify and evaluate practicable alternatives.*

As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, there is no practicable alternative to locate it outside the floodplain. The New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) considered two primary alternatives to the proposed project:

- A. A No Action Alternative, in which there would be no reconstruction of the boardwalk between Beach 20th and 126th Streets and no crossing structures across the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) dune between Beach 126th Street and Beach 149th Street.

The No Action Alternative would not support PlaNYC's goals to increase the sustainability and resiliency of open space resources, and would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula. The No Action Alternative also is inconsistent with New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), which identifies reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk as a key rebuilding project.

- B. An Original Height Alternative, in which the boardwalk would be rebuilt at its original height with no raising of the elevation or the inclusion of resiliency features.

While the Original Height Alternative would be designed and constructed to be more resilient to future storms than the former boardwalk, the alternative would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlaNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because it would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise.

- C. A No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative, in which the boardwalk would be rebuilt as under the proposed project except that there would be no sand-retaining wall constructed under the boardwalk.

While the No-Sand Retaining Wall Alternative would provide the same resiliency to future storms as the proposed project, it would not retain the infill sand under the boardwalk and, therefore, would not protect the adjacent communities by helping to protect newly created dunes or preventing sand migration over adjacent roadways, homes, and open space areas.

Step 4: *Identify Potential Direct and Indirect Impacts Associated with Floodplain Development.*

While the proposed reconstruction of the boardwalk would occur within the 100-year floodplain, the boardwalk would be raised to an elevation of up to 3 feet above the 100-year base flood elevation (BFE) and would incorporate other measures to increase resilience to future storm events. The proposed sand-retaining wall and sand fill between the USACE dune and the boardwalk would prevent sand migration and restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area, thereby providing additional resilience to communities to the north. Overall, construction and operation of the proposed project would not result in significant adverse impacts to flood levels, flood risk, or the flow of flood waters in the project site or surrounding areas. Therefore, the proposed

project would be compliant with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (44 CFR § 59) and Floodplain Management Executive Order 11988 (42 FR 26951).

The construction and operation of the proposed project would not adversely affect the functioning of the renourished beach (currently being undertaken by USACE) as a natural protective feature area as identified under Coastal Erosion Hazard Areas (CEHA) and its functioning to protect the community against erosion or high water, or adversely affect existing erosion protection structures, and would meet the standards for issuance of a coastal erosion management permit as well as a Tidal Wetlands permit by the New York State Department of Conservation (NYSDEC).

The natural resources of the floodplain include water, biological, and societal resources.

Construction and operation of the proposed project would not adversely affect the Brooklyn-Queens sole source aquifer or drinking water supplies. Groundwater is not used as a potable water supply in the area. Therefore, the proposed project would not have the potential to result in significant adverse impacts to groundwater resources on or in the vicinity of the project site, and would be compliant with Section 1424(e) of the Safe Drinking Water Act. The proposed project would not adversely affect soils or geology within the study area or result in the loss of sand resources. Sand placed below the boardwalk between the sand-retaining wall and the USACE dune from an upland or off-shore source will be compatible with the existing beach sand and would not affect the nature of the existing sand resources within the project site. Within the project site, the depth of sand below the surface extends more than 45 feet. Therefore, piles driven for the reconstructed boardwalk and for the sand-retaining wall would not extend to bedrock and would not have the potential to affect geologic resources.

Construction and operation of the proposed project would not adversely affect the buffering function of the NYSDEC tidal wetlands adjacent area within the project site to protect the NYSDEC littoral zone tidal wetlands mapped along the ocean side portion of the beach. Therefore, the proposed project would meet the requirements for authorization under Article 25 of the Environmental Conservation Law for activities within the NYSDEC tidal wetland adjacent area and would be compliant with federal Executive Order 11990.

The proposed ramps and stairs over the maritime dunes community between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets would be designed to minimize impacts to the development and stability of a vegetated maritime dunes community within this portion of the project site and would enhance dune stability by minimizing disturbance due to pedestrian passage. Should any maritime dunes habitat be disturbed during the reconstruction of the boardwalk, they would be restored with native maritime plant species. Through the restoration program, the proposed project has the potential to enhance this community in many locations along the project site. Overall, the proposed project would not have significant adverse impacts to plants or ecological communities in the vicinity of the project site.

Construction between Beach 17th and Beach 73rd Streets, where piping plovers, least terns, and common terns are known to nest, would be limited to the non-breeding period (early fall to late winter) to avoid potential impacts to these sensitive, listed species. The potential need to include additional area within the project site in which construction activity would also be limited to the non-breeding period for piping plover (i.e., a buffer beyond the Beach 17th Street and Beach 73rd Street breeding area) to further avoid impacts to these species during the breeding season would be determined in consultation with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) and NYSDEC. A planting and

propagation program for the dune sandspur, and any other confirmed rare, threatened or endangered plant species within the project site would be developed in coordination with DPR and/or NYSDEC/ New York Natural Heritage Program (NYNHP). Overall, the proposed project would not significantly affect the quantity, quality, or types of habitat that would be available to wildlife in the study area. The proposed project would therefore comply with the federal Endangered Species Act and New York State's Endangered and Threatened Species of Fish and Wildlife Act and Removal of Trees and Protected Plants regulations.

Societal resources were also considered during the design process. The design for the proposed project is meant to complement the natural features of the area and to offer aesthetically pleasing structures. The proposed project would reconstruct parkland facilities that were destroyed by Hurricane Sandy and would have a beneficial impact on the quality of existing open space, thereby improving access and enjoyment of this critical regional open space resource by local residents and visitors.

Step 5: *Where practicable, design or modify the proposed action to minimize the potential adverse impacts to lives, property, and natural values within the floodplain and to restore, and preserve the values of the floodplain.*

- A. Preserving Lives and Property. The reconstructed boardwalk will be more resilient and will, therefore, minimize the extensive debris and property damage that affected the inland Rockaway communities.
- B. Preserving Natural Values and Minimizing Impacts. By raising the boardwalk to an elevation of up to 3 feet above the 100-year base flood elevation, construction and operation of the proposed project would not result in significant adverse impacts to flood levels, flood risk, or the flow of flood waters in the project site or surrounding areas. Construction and operation of the proposed project would not adversely affect the Brooklyn-Queens sole source aquifer, drinking water supplies, or the buffering function of the NYSDEC tidal wetlands adjacent area within the project site to protect the NYSDEC littoral zone tidal wetlands mapped along the ocean side portion of the beach. The proposed ramps and stairs over the maritime dunes community between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets would be designed to minimize impacts to the development and stability of a vegetated maritime dunes community within this portion of the project site and would enhance dune stability by minimizing disturbance due to pedestrian passage. Should any maritime dunes habitat be disturbed during the reconstruction of the boardwalk, they would be restored with native maritime plant species. Through the restoration program, the proposed project has the potential to enhance this community in many locations along the project site. Construction between Beach 17th and Beach 73rd Streets, where piping plovers, least terns, and common terns are known to nest, would be limited to the non-breeding period (early fall to late winter) to avoid potential impacts to these sensitive, listed species. The potential need to include additional area within the project site in which construction activity would also be limited to the non-breeding period for piping plover (i.e., a buffer beyond the Beach 17th Street and Beach 73rd Street breeding area) to further avoid impacts to these species during the breeding season would be determined in consultation with the USFWS and NYSDEC. A planting and propagation program for the dune sandspur, and any other confirmed rare, threatened or endangered plant species within the project site would be developed in coordination with NYCDPR and/or NYSDEC/NYNHP.

Step 6: *Reevaluate the Alternatives.*

The No Action Alternative is impracticable because: 1) it is inconsistent with New York City's SIRR, which identifies reconstruction of the boardwalk as a key rebuilding project; and 2) it would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula.

The Original Height Alternative is impracticable because: 1) it would likely limit future potential projects that could be implemented as part of any USACE long-term reformulation plan for the area; and 2) it would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlaNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because the boardwalk would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise.

The No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative is impracticable because it would not protect the adjacent community by preventing sand migration. It would not restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area.

Step 7: *Determination of No Practicable Alternative.*

As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, it is our determination that there is no practicable alternative to the proposed project's location in the floodplain. The project is expected to have no adverse effects on the floodplain or the natural and societal resources that characterize the floodplain.

A final notice was published on December 13, 2013 detailing the reasons why the proposed project must be located in the floodplain, a list of alternatives considered, and all mitigation measures taken to minimize adverse impacts and preserve natural and beneficial floodplain values. No concerns were expressed by the public concerning this notice.

Step 8: *Implement the Proposed Action.*

The City will assure that this plan, as described above, is executed and necessary language will be included in all agreements with participating parties. The City will also take an active role in monitoring the construction process to ensure no unnecessary impacts occur nor unnecessary risks are taken.

To: All interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

This publication gives notice that New York City has conducted an evaluation of the proposed Rockaway Beach Boardwalk reconstruction and related improvements, as required by Executive Orders (EO) 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands, respectively. These evaluations are made to determine the potential effects that proposed activities in the floodplain and wetland associated with the proposed project will have on the human environment. New York City will receive federal Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding from HUD to execute the reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvements.

The City has considered the following alternatives to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of its floodplains:

Action Outside the Floodplain: As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, there is no practicable alternative to locate it outside the floodplain.

Proposed Action in the Floodplain: The project site is located within the 100-year floodplain, and New York City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the boardwalk between Beach 20th and Beach 126th Streets and to improve its future storm resiliency by raising the overall elevation to account for both revised 100-year flood elevations and predicted future sea level rise. Further, the proposed reconstruction would incorporate a sand-retaining wall underneath the boardwalk that would prevent sand migration and help to protect the adjacent community. The sand-retaining wall would span the length of the boardwalk and would retain the volume of sand extending from new dunes currently being constructed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to the sand-retaining wall under the boardwalk. The wall would also restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area. The CDBG-DR funds would also be used to provide structured access to the beach between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets over the new USACE dunes and to restore and enhance existing dunes between Beach 9th and Beach 20th Streets, including constructing at-grade access through the dunes. Overall, the proposed project would restore a damaged recreational resource while increasing the resiliency of the boardwalk against future storms, enhance beach access, and help protect newly created dunes.

No Action: The No Action Alternative would not support PlaNYC's goals to increase the sustainability and resiliency of open space resources, and would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula. The No Action Alternative is also inconsistent with New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), which identifies reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk as a key rebuilding project. Under the No Action Alternative, the boardwalk would not be reconstructed between Beach 20th and 126th Streets,

structures across the USACE dune between Beach 126th Street and Beach 149th Street would not be constructed, and the existing dunes between Beach 20th and Beach 9th Streets would not be restored.

Original Height Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt at its original height with no raising of the elevation or the inclusion of resiliency features. While the Original Height Alternative would be designed and constructed to be more resilient to future storms than the former boardwalk, the alternative would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlaNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because it would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise.

No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt as under the proposed project except that there would be no sand-retaining wall constructed under the boardwalk. While the No-Sand Retaining Wall Alternative would provide the same resiliency to future storms as the proposed project, it would not retain the infill sand under the boardwalk and, therefore, would not protect the adjacent communities by helping to protect newly created dunes or preventing sand migration over adjacent roadways, homes, and open space areas.

This **FINAL NOTICE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSAL TO SUPPORT ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN** is required by Section 2(a)(4) of EOs 11998 and 11990, respectively for Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands and is implemented by HUD regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. The 8-step Decision Making Process includes public notices and the examination of practicable alternatives to building in the floodplain or wetland. The City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the Rockaway Boardwalk, provide structured access to the beach over new USACE dunes, and restore and enhance existing dunes located within the 100-year floodplain.

The City is interested in alternatives and public perceptions of possible adverse effects that could result from the project as well as potential mitigation measures.

131-60 Special Permit for Auditoriums

The special permit set forth in this Section is established to allow outdoor entertainment #uses# on a limited-term basis in a unique beachfront location within the #Special Coney Island District#. The #development# of such a #use# on a temporary basis pursuant to this special permit provides for the opportunity for a valuable public amenity to exist within an area that, while approved for future #residential development# pursuant to the #Special Coney Island District# plan, is currently underutilized and does not exhibit the characteristics of a well-developed #residential# neighborhood. Any special permit granted under this Section shall be subject to a term of years, in order to ensure that such #use# is consistent with and does not impede the goal of long-term revitalization of the surrounding area, pursuant to the #Special Coney Island District# plan.

In the Coney West Subdistrict, for Parcels B and G, the City Planning Commission may approve, by special permit, open-air auditoriums with greater than 2,000 seats, for a term no greater than ten years from the date a certificate of occupancy, including a temporary certificate of occupancy, has been issued, provided that the proposed auditorium meets the conditions of paragraph (a) and the findings of paragraph (b) of this Section, in addition to the #sign# and parking provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Section, respectively.

For any application for such special permit, the applicant shall provide plans to the Commission including but not limited to a site plan, signage plan, parking and loading plan, lighting plan and operations plan (the "Proposed Plans").

(a) The Commission may permit open-air auditoriums with a maximum of 5,100 seats, provided the Proposed Plans demonstrate that:

- (1) at all times when the Riegelmann Boardwalk is open to the public, all publically accessible space, as shown on the proposed plans, will remain accessible to the public, except that access may be restricted as necessary during scheduled events, for the setup and takedown for such events, and in connection with maintenance activities; any barriers erected for the purpose of restricting access or visibility during such events shall be completely removed at all other times;
- (2) the height of all structures, temporary or fixed, does not exceed 70 feet in height, as measured from the level of the Riegelmann Boardwalk;
- (3) any roof or structural canopy above the open-air auditorium seating area will be removed prior to the month of November and shall remain removed during the entire off-season period between November through April, as well as in advance of severe weather events;
- (4) the signage plan and parking and loading plan comply with the provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Section, respectively; and
- (5) the City and applicant will enter into an agreement under which Parcel G will be

returned to the City as of the expiration of the term of the special permit in a condition set forth in such agreement appropriate for #use# as a #public park#.

(b) In granting such permit, the Commission shall find that:

(1) such open-air auditorium will not unduly impair the essential character or the future #use# or #development# of the surrounding area, pursuant to the goals and objectives of the #Special Coney Island District# plan;

(2) the outdoor lighting for such open-air auditorium is located and arranged so as to minimize any negative effects on nearby #residences# and #community facilities#, and that Proposed Plans include noise attenuation features and measures which serve to reduce the effect of noise from the open-air auditorium on the surrounding area, including nearby #residences# and #community facilities#;

(3) the construction of a stage as part of any #building# on Parcel B, for the purpose of accommodating an open-air auditorium #use#, will:

(i) enable the stage area to be closed to the outdoor portion of the open-air auditorium during the off-season when the open-air auditorium is not in use, so as to be operated for indoor entertainment #uses# with an eating and drinking establishment or other #use# permitted on Parcel B; and

(ii) allow for such #building# to be operated subsequent to the expiration of the special permit for #uses# permitted on Parcel B, such as eating or drinking establishments with entertainment;

(4) appropriate visual and pedestrian connections are maintained in the general area of the former street bed from the termination of West 22nd Street to the Riegelmann Boardwalk;

(5) the portions of the site not dedicated to stage area or event seating are so designed to serve as a full time park-like resource for the public, and the portions of the site designed for open-air auditorium #use# serve as a high-quality open space resource when not in auditorium use;

(6) any roof or structural canopy above the open-air auditorium seating area will be visually unobtrusive, and maximize openness and visibility between the site and the Riegelmann Boardwalk;

(7) the operations plan, which shall include a protocol for queuing for concert-goers, demonstrates that there would be no interference with the public use and enjoyment of adjacent public facilities; and

(8) the site plan, signage plan and lighting plan incorporate good design, effectively integrate the site with surrounding streets and the Riegelmann Boardwalk, and are consistent with the purposes of the #Special Coney Island District#.

(c) The Commission may, through approval of the Proposed Plans, permit #signs# notwithstanding the applicable #sign# regulations, except that #flashing signs# shall not be permitted and only #advertising signs# that are oriented toward the interior of the open-air amphitheater and not visible from the Riegelmann Boardwalk or other public area shall be permitted.

In order to permit such #signs#, the Commission shall find that proposed signage is appropriate in connection with the permitted open-air auditorium #use#, is not unduly concentrated within one portion of the site, and will not negatively affect the surrounding area.

(d) The Commission may, through approval of the Proposed Plans, reduce or waive required parking or loading requirements, provided the Commission finds that the open-air auditorium will be adequately served by a combination of surrounding public parking facilities and mass transit. In addition, the Commission shall find that the proposed loading facilities on the site are located so as not to adversely affect the movement of pedestrians or vehicles on the #streets# surrounding the auditorium.

The City Planning Commission may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding area. Such conditions and safeguards may include, but are not limited to restrictions on signage or requirements for soundproofing of auditoriums, shielding of floodlights or screening of open #uses#.

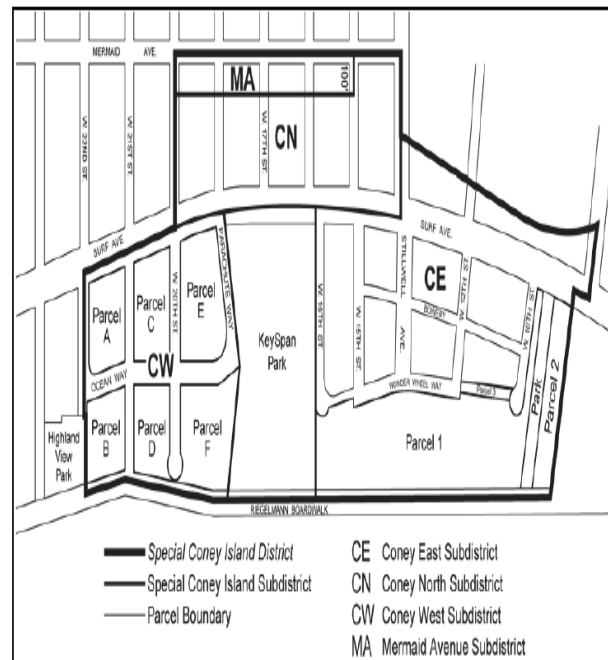
Upon the first issuance of this permit for an open-air auditorium, the effective period of the permit shall be ten years from the date a certificate of occupancy, including a temporary certificate of occupancy, has been issued. To establish the term of years for subsequent applications for this special permit, the Commission shall, in determining whether the finding of paragraph (b)(1) of this Section is met, take into account the existing character of the surrounding area, as well as #residential# and #community facility development# proposed or under construction on surrounding #blocks#, and shall also consider whether continuation of such auditorium #use# within a proposed term of years would be compatible with or may hinder achievement of the goals and objectives of the #Special Coney Island District# plan.

Subsequent applications for this special permit shall be filed no later than one year prior to expiration of the term of the permit then in effect.

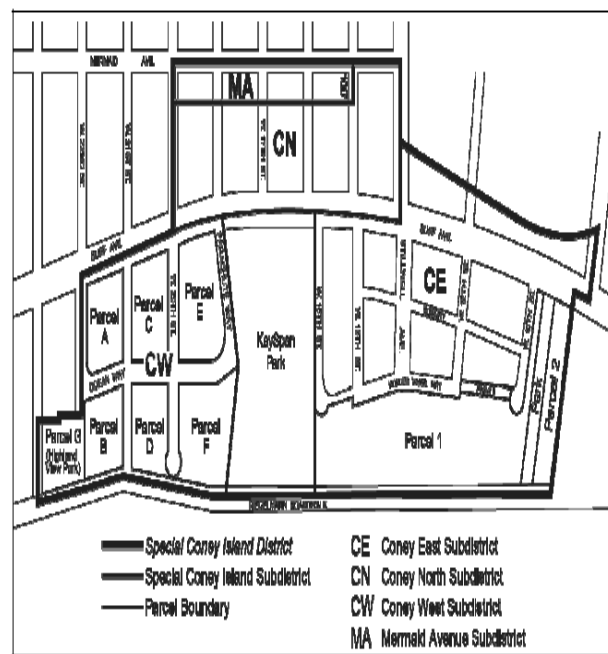

Map 4 - Street Wall Location

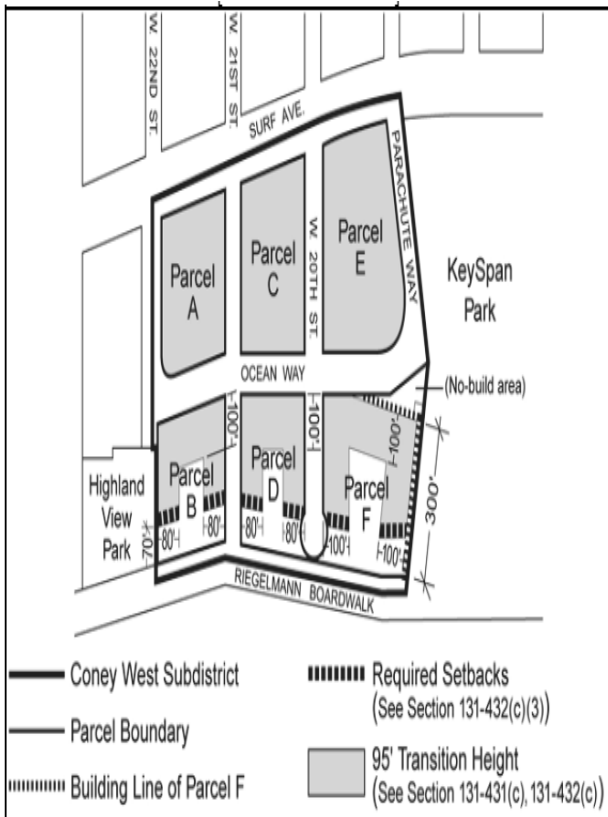

Map 5 - Minimum and Maximum Base Heights

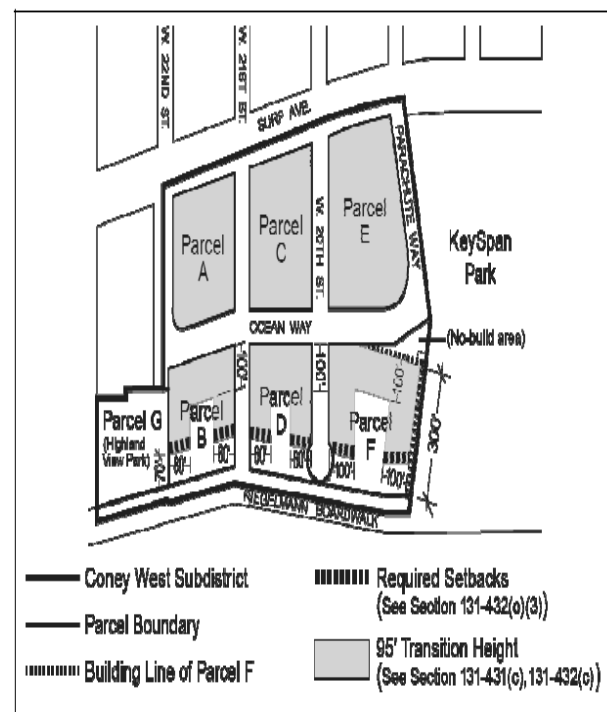

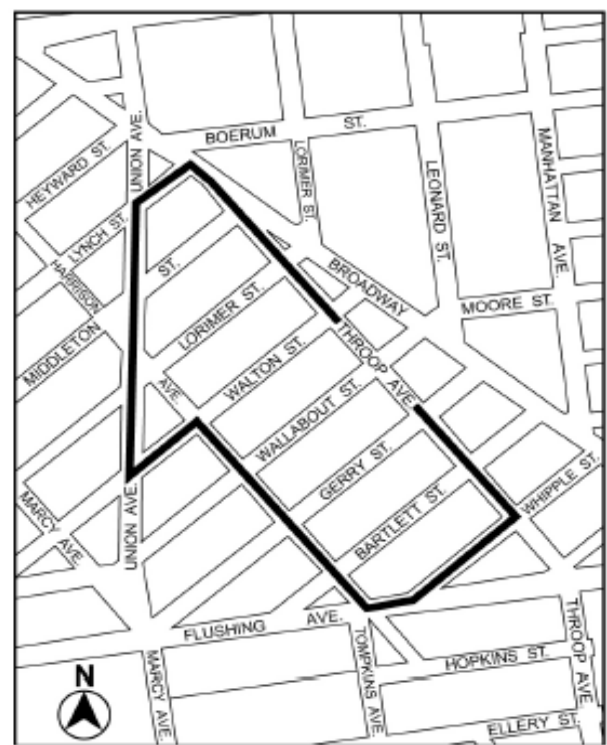

To: All interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

This publication gives notice that New York City has conducted an evaluation of the proposed Rockaway Beach Boardwalk reconstruction and related improvements, as required by Executive Orders (EO) 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands, respectively. These evaluations are made to determine the potential effects that proposed activities in the floodplain and wetland associated with the proposed project will have on the human

environment. New York City will receive federal Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding from HUD to execute the reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvements.

The City has considered the following alternatives to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of its floodplains:

Action Outside the Floodplain: As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, there is no practicable alternative to locate it outside the floodplain.

Proposed Action in the Floodplain: The project site is located within the 100-year floodplain, and New York City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the boardwalk between Beach 20th and Beach 126th Streets and to improve its future storm resiliency by raising the overall elevation to account for both revised 100-year flood elevations and predicted future sea level rise. Further, the proposed reconstruction would incorporate a sand-retaining wall underneath the boardwalk that would prevent sand migration and help to protect the adjacent community. The sand-retaining wall would span the length of the boardwalk and would retain the volume of sand extending from new dunes currently being constructed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to the sand-retaining wall under the boardwalk. The wall would also restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area. The CDBG-DR funds would also be used to provide structured access to the beach between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets over the new USACE dunes and to restore and enhance existing dunes between Beach 9th and Beach 20th Streets, including constructing at-grade access through the dunes. Overall, the proposed project would restore a damaged recreational resource while increasing the resiliency of the boardwalk against future storms, enhance beach access, and help protect newly created dunes.

No Action: The No Action Alternative would not support PlaNYC's goals to increase the sustainability and resiliency of open space resources, and would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula. The No Action Alternative is also inconsistent with New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), which identifies reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk as a key rebuilding project. Under the No Action Alternative, the boardwalk would not be reconstructed between Beach 20th and 126th Streets, structures across the USACE dune between Beach 126th Street and Beach 149th Street would not be constructed, and the existing dunes between Beach 20th and Beach 9th Streets would not be restored.

Original Height Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt at its original height with no raising of the elevation or the inclusion of resiliency features. While the Original Height Alternative would be designed and constructed to be more resilient to future storms than the former boardwalk, the alternative would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlaNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because it would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise.

No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt as under the proposed project except that there would be no sand-retaining wall constructed under the boardwalk. While the No-Sand Retaining Wall Alternative would provide the same resiliency to future storms as the proposed project, it would not retain the infill sand under the boardwalk and, therefore, would not protect the adjacent communities by helping to protect newly created dunes or preventing sand migration over adjacent roadways, homes, and open space areas.

This **FINAL NOTICE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSAL TO SUPPORT ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN** is required by Section 2(a)(4) of EOs 11998 and 11990, respectively for Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands and is implemented by HUD regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. The 8-step Decision Making Process includes public notices and the examination of practicable alternatives to building in the floodplain or wetland. The City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the Rockaway Boardwalk, provide structured access to the beach over new USACE dunes, and restore and enhance existing dunes located within the 100-year floodplain.

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REVENUE AND CONCESSIONS

NOTICE

In accordance with Section 1-14 of the Concession Rules of the City of New York ("Concession Rules"), the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks) intends to enter into negotiations with only Super Value Inc. for a license agreement for the operation and maintenance of two gasoline service stations on the Hutchinson River Parkway (Northbound and Southbound), near the Westchester Avenue Exit, Bronx.

The concession will have a short term and will commence on August 27, 2013 (retroactive to the expiration of the previous license agreement) and expire on April 30, 2015. The concession will be operated pursuant to a license issued by Parks; no leasehold or other proprietary right will be offered. As compensation to the City, Parks requires a monthly fee of at least \$17,900.00.

At this time, it is neither practicable nor advantageous to award this concession by competitive sealed proposals or competitive sealed bids due to the existence of a time-sensitive situation where a concession must be awarded quickly or significant revenues will be lost. The existing concession agreement expired in August 2013. Without a negotiated short-term concession, this facility will remain vacant since Parks does not have the capability or the resources to operate, maintain or secure the gasoline service stations. Service to the public will be interrupted and significant revenue to the City will be lost in concession fees.

An RFP for this concession was originally issued on October 5, 2012 with the intent of making an award prior to the expiration of the then existing concession agreement; however, Parks is unable to make an award pursuant to that RFP because material information regarding ownership of the underground storage tanks, gasoline pumps and dispensers that are currently on the premises came to Parks' attention subsequent to the close of the RFP process.

Parks has determined that it is in the City's best interest to negotiate only with the previous concessionaire, Super Value Inc., because they own the underground storage tanks, gasoline pumps and dispensers and they are currently occupying and operating the premises and have been since their license expired. As part of the negotiated concession, Super Value Inc. will be required to remove the existing underground gasoline storage tanks, gasoline pumps and dispensers, restore the premises and undertake any necessary environmental remediation of the premises before the end of the term. This negotiated concession is meant to act as a short-term solution to bridge the gap until a new competitive RFP solicitation, evaluation, and award process have concluded and to allow time for the existing underground storage tanks, pumps and dispensers to be removed from the premises before the start of any longer term concession.

Therefore, pursuant to the Concession Rules and with the approval of the Director of the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, Parks will negotiate only with Super Value Inc. However, if you want to express interest in the proposed concession or obtain additional information concerning the proposer concession, please contact Lauren Standke, Project

READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in The City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays.

NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptroller's Office at www.comptroller.nyc.gov, and click on Prevailing Wage Schedules to view rates.

CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$17 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. Registration for these lists is free of charge. To register for these lists, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application, which can be found online at www.nyc.gov/selltonyc. To request a paper copy of the application, or if you are uncertain whether you have already submitted an application, call the Vendor Enrollment Center at (212) 857-1680.

SELLING TO GOVERNMENT TRAINING WORKSHOP

New and experienced vendors are encouraged to register for a free training course on how to do business with New York City. "Selling to Government" workshops are conducted by the Department of Small Business Services at 110 William Street, New York, NY 10038. Sessions are convened on the second Tuesday of each month from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. For more information, and to register, call (212) 618-8845 or visit www.nyc.gov/html/sbs/nycbiz and click on Summary of Services, followed by Selling to Government.

PRE-QUALIFIED LISTS

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstances. When an agency decides to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR. Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such lists may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification questionnaire may be submitted to an Agency Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated, and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH). Section 3-10 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists. For information regarding specific pre-qualified lists, please visit www.nyc.gov/selltonyc.

NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board Rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, and the Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders lists for Non-Mayoral entities should contact these entities directly at the addresses given in the Vendor Information Manual.

PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 9:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays. For more information, contact the Mayor's Office of Contract Services at (212) 341-0933 or visit www.nyc.gov/mocs.

ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. To obtain a copy of the certification application and to learn more about this program, contact the Department of Small Business Services at (212) 513-6311 or visit www.nyc.gov/sbs and click on M/WBE Certification and Access.

PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City pays interest on all late invoices. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest; these are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year: in January and in July.

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.

La exmandataria Michelle Bachelet, candidata de la coalición de partidos de centro e izquierda Nueva Mayoría, obtuvo en la primera vuelta de los comicios, celebrada el pasado 17 de noviembre, un respaldo del 47%, pero le faltaron tres puntos para adjudicarse automáticamente la banda presidencial.

Evelyn Matthei, representante de la Alianza por Chile, la coalición conservadora actualmente en el poder, se que-

dó a casi 22 puntos de su contendiente, pero logró forzar la segunda vuelta. Por primera vez en la historia del país los chilenos podían elegir presidente mediante inscripción automática y voto voluntario, pero ese día hubo una baja participación y más de la mitad decidió quedarse en casa.

A estas alturas, nadie se atreve a decir en qué medida beneficia o perjudica la abstención a cada candidatura.

PR apunta a 'bono basura'

SAN JUAN/EFE — Puerto Rico logró ingresar en los cinco primeros meses de su año fiscal (julio-noviembre) un 12.4 % más que en el mismo periodo de 2012, aunque el recaudo de noviembre se quedó por debajo de lo previsto por la isla, cuya deuda sufre la creciente amenaza de una degradación a "bono basura".

El Banco Gubernamental de Fomento de Puerto Rico informó ayer de que en los primeros cinco meses del año fiscal ingresó \$3,278.3 millones, lo que supone un aumento de 334.6 millones respecto a los 2,943.7 millones ingresados entre

julio y noviembre de 2012. Este dato está además ligeramente por encima de los 3,199.8 millones que la Administración de la isla caribeña se había propuesto ingresar.

El incremento fue posible pese a que en noviembre se ingresaron \$522 millones, frente a los 569.6 previstos.

La secretaria de Hacienda, Melba Acosta, quiso quitar importancia a este último dato y apuntó que "normalmente noviembre es uno de los meses menos importantes en materia de recaudación" impositiva.

Propuesta en un Terreno de 100 años de Inundación

Para: Todas las Agencias, Grupos e Individuos interesados

Esta publicación da aviso de que la Ciudad de Nueva York ha llevado a cabo una evaluación de la propuesta de reconstrucción y mejoras relacionadas con el Malecón de Rockaway Beach, como lo requieren las Ordenes Ejecutivas (EO) 11988 y 11990, conforme a las regulaciones de HUD en el 24 CFR 55.20 Subparte C de los Procedimientos para Hacer Determinaciones sobre gestiones en Terrenos Aluviales y para Protección de los Humedales, respectivamente. Estas evaluaciones se realizan para determinar los posibles efectos que las actividades propuestas en el terreno de inundación y humedales asociados con el proyecto propuesto tendrían sobre el medio ambiente humano. La Ciudad de Nueva York recibirá una subvención de fondos federales para Desarrollo Comunal-Recuperación ante Desastres (CDBG-DR) de HUD para ejecutar la reconstrucción del Malecón de Rockaway Beach y las mejoras relacionadas.

La ciudad ha considerado las siguientes alternativas que deben tomarse para minimizar los impactos adversos y para restaurar y preservar los valores naturales y beneficiosos de sus terrenos aluviales:

Acción fuera de terrenos de inundación como el Malecón de Rockaway Beach es un gran espacio público abierto en la Península de Rockaways y un componente integral de Rockaway Beach, no hay ninguna alternativa viable para localizarlo fuera del terreno aluvial.

Acción Propuesta en Terreno de Inundación el sitio del proyecto se encuentra ubicado en un terreno de 100 años de inundación, y la ciudad de Nueva York se propone utilizar los fondos del CDBG-DR para reconstruir el Malecón entre las calles Beach 20 y Beach 126 y mejorar su resistencia futura a tormentas levantando la elevación general teniendo en cuenta ambas revisiones de las elevaciones de inundación de 100 años y predecido futuras elevaciones del nivel del mar. Además, la reconstrucción propuesta incluirá un muro de retención de arena debajo del malecón que evitará la migración de arena y ayudará a proteger a la comunidad adyacente. La pared de retención de arena atravesará la longitud del malecón y conservará el volumen de arena que se extiende desde las dunas nuevas actualmente siendo construidas por el Ejército de Ingenieros de Estados Unidos (USACE) hasta la pared de retención de arena bajo el muelle. La pared también restringirá el flujo de arena que pasa bajo el malecón desde la playa a la zona interior. Los fondos de CDBG-DR también se utilizarán para proporcionar acceso estructurado a la playa, entre las calles Beach 126 y Beach 149 sobre las nuevas dunas de USACE y para restaurar y mejorar las dunas existentes entre las calles Beach 9 y Beach 20, incluyendo construcción de acceso al grado a través de las dunas de la playa. En general, el proyecto propuesto restauraría un recurso recreativo dañado mientras que aumenta la resistencia de la Rambla contra las tormentas futuras, mejora el acceso a la playa y ayuda a proteger las playas recién creadas.

Ninguna Acción: La alternativa de No Acción no apoyaría los objetivos del PlaNYC para aumentar la sostenibilidad y la resiliencia de los recursos de espacio abierto y proporcionarían menos accesibilidad al usuario del parque y disfrute del recurso único del espacio abierto de las playas de la Península de Rockaway. La alternativa de No Acción también es inconsistentemente con la iniciativa especial de la ciudad de Nueva York para la reconstrucción y resiliencia (SIRR), que identifica la reconstrucción del Malecón de Rockaway Beach como proyecto clave de reconstrucción. Bajo la alternativa de No Acción, el malecón no podría ser reconstruido entre las calles Beach 20 y Beach 126, las estructuras a través de la duna de USACE entre la calle Beach 126 y la calle Beach 149 no serían construidas, y las dunas existentes entre las calles Beach 20 y Beach 9 no serían restauradas.

Alternativa a la Altura Original: Bajo esta alternativa, el paseo marítimo sería reconstruido a su altura original con ningún aumento de la elevación o la inclusión de características de resiliencia. Mientras que la Alternativa a la Altura Original podría ser diseñada y construida para ser más resistente a las tormentas futuras que el antiguo Malecón, la alternativa sería menos consistente con las metas y objetivos de PlaNYC y el SIRR que el proyecto propuesto, porque no se elevaría la altura para adaptarse a futuros niveles del mar.

Alternativa de No Hacer Pared de Retención de Arena: Bajo esta alternativa, el paseo marítimo sería reconstruido como bajo el proyecto propuesto excepto que no habría ningún muro de retención de arena construido debajo del paseo marítimo. Mientras que la alternativa de muro de retención de arena No ofrecería la misma resistencia a futuras tormentas como el proyecto propuesto, no reduciría la arena de relleno debajo del paseo marítimo y, por lo tanto, no podría proteger a las comunidades adyacentes, las dunas recién creadas o prevenir la migración de arena sobre las carreteras adyacentes, casas y espacios abiertos.

PARA AVISO FINAL PARA REVISIÓN DEL PÚBLICO DE UNA PROPUESTA PARA APOYAR ACTIVIDADES EN UN TERRENO DE 100 AÑOS DE INUNDACIÓN lo requiere la Sección 260(4) del EOP 11988 y 11990, respectivamente para la gestión de terrenos aluviales y protección de los humedales y es implementado por las regulaciones de HUD encontradas en el 24 CFR 55.20 Subparte C de los Procedimientos para Hacer Determinaciones sobre el Manejo de Terrenos Aluviales. El Proceso de Decisión de 8 pasos incluye avisos públicos y el examen de alternativas prácticas para construir en terrenos aluviales o humedales. La ciudad se propone utilizar los fondos de CDBG-DR para reconstruir el Malecón de Rockaway, proporcionar acceso estructurado a la playa sobre las nuevas dunas de USACE, restaurar y mejorar las dunas existentes situadas en el terreno de 100 años de inundación.





Final Notice and Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain

To: All Interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

This publication gives notice that New York City has conducted an evaluation of the proposed Rockaway Beach Boardwalk reconstruction and related improvements, as required by Executive Orders (EO) 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands, respectively. These evaluations are made to determine the potential effects that proposed activities in the floodplain and wetland associated with the proposed project will have on the human environment. New York City will receive federal Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding from HUD to execute the reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvements.

The City has considered the following alternatives to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of its floodplains:

Action Outside the Floodplain: As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, there is no practicable alternative to locate it outside the floodplain.

Proposed Action in the Floodplain: The project site is located within the 100-year floodplain, and New York City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the boardwalk between Beach 20th and Beach 126th Streets and to improve its future storm resiliency by raising the overall elevation to account for both revised 100-year flood elevations and predicted future sea level rise. Further, the proposed reconstruction would incorporate a sand-retaining wall underneath the boardwalk that would prevent sand migration and help to protect the adjacent dunes. The sand-retaining wall would span the length of the boardwalk and would retain the volume of sand extending from new dunes currently being constructed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to the sand-retaining wall under the boardwalk. The wall would also restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area. The CDBG-DR funds would also be used to provide structured access to the beach between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets over the new USACE dunes and to restore and enhance existing dunes between Beach 9th and Beach 20th Streets, including constructing at-grade access through the dunes. Overall, the proposed project would restore a damaged recreational resource while increasing the resiliency of the boardwalk against future storms, enhance beach access, and help protect newly created dunes.

No Action: The No Action Alternative would not support PlaNYC's goals to increase the sustainability and resiliency of open space resources, and would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula. The No Action Alternative is also inconsistent with New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), which identifies reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk as a key rebuilding project. Under the No Action Alternative, the boardwalk would not be reconstructed between Beach 20th and 126th Streets, structures across the USACE dune between Beach 126th Street and Beach 149th Street would not be constructed, and the existing dunes between Beach 20th and Beach 9th Streets would not be restored.

Original Height Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt at its original height with no raising of the elevation or the inclusion of resiliency features. While the Original Height Alternative would be designed and constructed to be more resilient to future storms than the former boardwalk, the alternative would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlaNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because it would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise.

No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt as under the proposed project except that there would be no sand-retaining wall constructed under the boardwalk. While the No-Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative would provide the same resiliency to future storms as the proposed project, it would not retain the infill sand under the boardwalk and, therefore, would not protect the adjacent communities by helping to protect newly created dunes or preventing sand migration over adjacent roadways, homes, and open space areas.

This FINAL NOTICE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSAL TO SUPPORT ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN is required by Section 2(a)(4) of EOs 11988 and 11990, respectively for Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands and is implemented by HUD regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. The 8-step Decision Making Process includes public notices and the examination of practicable alternatives to building in the floodplain or wetland. The City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the Rockaway Boardwalk, provide structured access to the beach over new USACE dunes, and restore and enhance existing dunes located within the 100-year floodplain.

Additional project information including floodplain maps of the project site are contained in the Environmental Review Record and Environmental Assessment currently on file with Calvin Johnson, Assistant Director CDBG-DR, 255 Greenwich Street, 8th Floor, New York, New York 10007 and may be examined from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The City is interested in alternatives and public perceptions of possible adverse effects that could result from the project as well as potential mitigation measures.



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

These evaluations are made to determine the potential effects that proposed activities in the floodplain and wetland associated with the proposed project will have on the human environment. New York City will receive federal Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding from HUD to execute the reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk and related improvements. The City has considered the following alternatives to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of its floodplains: Action Outside the Floodplain: As the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk is a major public open space in the Rockaways Peninsula and an integral component of Rockaway Beach, there is no practicable alternative to locate it outside the floodplain. Proposed Action in the Floodplain: The project site is located within the 100-year floodplain, and New York City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the boardwalk between Beach 20th and Beach 126th Streets and to improve its future storm resiliency by raising the ground elevation to account for both revised 100-year flood elevations and predicted future sea level rise. Further, the proposed reconstruction would incorporate a sand-retaining wall underneath the boardwalk that would prevent sand migration and help to protect the adjacent community. The sand-retaining wall would span the length of the boardwalk and would retain the volume of sand extending from new dunes currently being constructed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to the sand-retaining wall under the boardwalk. The wall would also restrict blowing sand from passing under the boardwalk from the beach to the inland area. The CDBG-DR funds would also be used to provide structured access to the beach between Beach 126th and Beach 149th Streets over the new USACE dunes and to restore and enhance existing dunes between Beach 9th and Beach 20th Streets, including constructing all-grade access through the dunes. Overall, the proposed project would restore a damaged recreational resource while increasing the resiliency of the boardwalk against future storms, enhance beach access, and help protect newly created dunes. No Action: The No Action Alternative would not support PlanNYC's goals to increase the sustainability and resiliency of open space resources, and would provide less park user accessibility and enjoyment of the unique open space resource of the beaches on the Rockaway Peninsula. The No Action Alternative is also inconsistent with New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), which identifies reconstruction of the Rockaway Beach Boardwalk as a key rebuilding project. Under the No Action Alternative, the boardwalk would not be reconstructed between Beach 20th and 126th Streets, structures across the USACE dune between Beach 126th Street and Beach 149th Street would not be constructed, and the existing dunes between Beach 20th and Beach 9th Streets would not be restored. Original Height Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt at its original height with no raising of the elevation or the inclusion of resiliency features. While the Original Height Alternative would be designed and constructed to be more resilient to future storms than the former boardwalk, the alternative would be less consistent with the goals and objectives of PlanNYC and the SIRR than the proposed project, because it would not be raised in height to accommodate future sea level rise. No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative: Under this alternative, the boardwalk would be rebuilt as under the proposed project, except that there would be no sand-retaining wall constructed under the boardwalk. While the No-Sand Retaining Wall Alternative would provide the same resiliency to future storms as the proposed project, it would not retain the fill sand under the boardwalk and, therefore, would not protect the adjacent communities by helping to protect newly created dunes or preventing sand migration over adjacent roadways, homes, and open space areas. This FINAL NOTICE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSAL TO SUPPORT ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN is required by Section 2(a)(4) of EOs 11988 and 11990, respectively by Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands and is implemented by HUD regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. The 8-step Decision Making Process includes public notices and the examination of practicable alternatives to building in the floodplain or wetland. The City proposes to use CDBG-DR funds to reconstruct the Rockaway Boardwalk, provide structured access to the beach over new USACE dunes, and restore and enhance existing dunes located within the 100-year floodplain. Additional project information including floodplain maps of the project site are contained in the Environmental Review Record and Environmental Assessment currently on file with Calvin Johnson, Assistant Director CDBG-DR, 255 Greenwich Street, 8th Floor, New York, New York 10007 and may be examined from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM. This posting can be found by using this link: http://www.nyc.gov/buildback and then clicking on "Reports and Public Notices." The City is interested in alternatives and public perceptions of possible adverse effects that could result from the project as well as potential mitigation measures. All interested persons, groups, and agencies are invited to submit written comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support the reconstruction of the Rockaway Boardwalk in a floodplain. 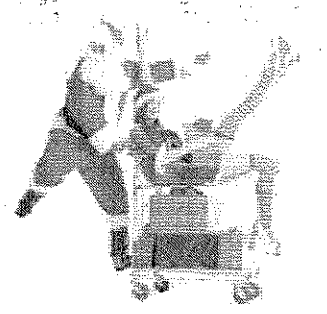

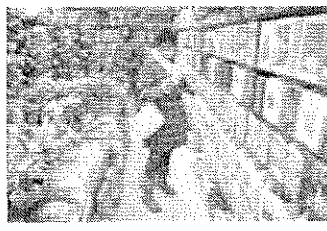

Эта публикация информирует о том, что Город Нью-Йорк провел оценку предлагаемой реконструкции Rockaway Beach Boardwalk и соответствующих улучшений, что предусмотрено Executive Orders (EO) 11388 и 11395, в соответствии с разделом HUD 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands. Эти оценки сделаны, чтобы определить возможные последствия предлагаемых действий в поймаемой зоне и водно-болотных угодьях для среды обитания человека. Нью-Йорк Сити получит федеральные финансирование по Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) от HUD для проведения реконструкции Rockaway Beach Boardwalk и соответствующих улучшений.

Город рассмотрит следующие альтернативы, призванные минимизировать негативное воздействие, восстановить и усилить природную и общественную ценность зоны затопления.

Действие за пределами поймаемой зоны поскольку Rockaway Beach Boardwalk является крупным открытым общественным пространством на полуострове Rockaway и составной частью Rockaway Beach, нет практических альтернатив по размещению его вне поймаемой зоны.

Предлагаемые действия в поймаемой зоне: участок реализации проекта расположен в 100-летней зоне затопления, и Нью-Йорк Сити предлагает использовать Фонды CDBG-DR для реконструкции набережной между Beach 20th и Beach 12th Streets и улучшить ее устойчивость перед штормами с помощью повышения общего уровня с учетом перспективной оценки населения на 50 лет и прогнозируемого повышения уровня океана. Далее предлагаемая реконструкция предусматривает установку под набережной защищающей песок стены, которая будет препятствовать вымыванию песка и повлечь в защите соседнего района. Эта стена будет простирается вдоль всей набережной и засорит песок на участке от новых дам, в настоящее время возводимых United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Стена также будет использоваться как дренажная пески для дренажа и снижения риска. Фонды CDBG-DR также будут использоваться для обеспечения структурного доступа к пляжу на участке между Beach 12th и Beach 14th Streets над новыми домами USACE, возводимыми и улучшение существующих дам между Beach 9th и Beach 20th Streets, включая строительство одноуровневого перехода через дамбу. В целом предлагаемый проект восстановит ущерб, нанесенный реконструкционному ресурсу, укрепит набережную в случае штормов в будущем, обеспечит доступ к пляжу и поможет защитить видовой ландшафт.

Важнейшая информация: No Action Alternative не затронет земельный ресурс на пляжах полуострова Rockaway. The No Action Alternative также не соответствует New York City's Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), согласно которой восстановление Rockaway Beach Boardwalk является ключевым проектом. Согласно No Action Alternative, набережная не должна быть перестроена между Beach 20th и 12th Streets, объекты напротив дома USACE между Beach 12th Street и Beach 14th Street не должны быть возведены, а существующие дамы между Beach 20th и Beach 9th Streets не должны быть восстановлены.

Original Right Alternative: согласно этой альтернативе, набережная должна быть восстановлена до своей изначальной высоты, без повышения уровня при реализации мер по усилению. Хотя Original Right Alternative предусматривает повышение устойчивости в случае шторма в будущем, она в меньшей степени соответствует цели R1NYC и SIRR, чем предлагаемый проект, поскольку не учитывает необходимость повышения уровня с учетом повышения уровня океана в будущем.

No Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative: согласно этой альтернативе, набережная должна быть перестроена, как предусмотрено предлагаемым проектом, однако под ней не должно быть возведена стена, защищающая песок. Хотя No-Sand-Retaining Wall Alternative гарантирует ту же степень устойчивости от шторма, что и предлагаемый проект, она не позволяет удерживать песок под набережной, в результате чего создаются условия, позволяющие вымывать песок. Созданный таким образом риск повреждения пляжу выше, чем создаваемый дамбами и открытыми пространствами.

Это окончательное извещение об общественной информации распространено в соответствии с разделом 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. Процесс принятия решения на 8 этапов включает общественные извещения и проверку практических альтернатив строительства в поймаемой зоне или водно-болотных угодьях. 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
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

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
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
