On any afternoon, visit one of the 35 **Parks Afterschool** locations and you will see children ages 6 to 13 participating in a wide variety of recreational, cultural, and educational programs. Three thousand children in the City of New York are served by the Parks Afterschool Program between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, the time when school-aged children are most in need of being in safe, supportive environments. Parks Afterschool youth receive homework help, participate in fitness activities, and explore arts & culture opportunities. Parks Afterschool programs complement what children are learning in schools and strengthen their sense of belonging to the communities in which they live.

A Banner Year for the Greenbelt!

Parks and the Greenbelt Conservancy recently celebrated the Carousel for all Children's tenth anniversary. The carousel, in Willowbrook Park in the Greenbelt, is a Victorian style, accessible merry-go-round that is decorated with 51 carved wooden figures and scenes of Staten Island. Visitors to the event commemorated its anniversary with a "birthday party," including birthday cake, games, and a visit from a clown.

But that's not the only cause for celebration in the Greenbelt this year – 2009 also marks the 5th anniversary of the Greenbelt Nature Center, the 20th anniversary of the Greenbelt Conservancy, and the 25th anniversary of the ribbon cutting on the Greenbelt.

The Greenbelt is a flagship park in the heart of Staten Island consisting of nearly 3,000 acres. The wide variety of environments found within the Greenbelt makes it a main attraction on Staten Island. The park is home to a nature center, a native plant center, and a wildlife refuge. Visitors can hike, bike, play golf, tennis or baseball and much more all in one amazing park!
