



MANHATTAN BEACH RULES



Beaches and Promenade Rules Prohibit:

- Littering and all glass containers
- Rummaging through trash receptacles
- Unleashed dogs at any time
- Barbecuing or open fires, except in designated areas
- Erecting tents or shelters
- Alcohol
- Amplified sound, except by permit
- Vending, engaging in commercial activity, and performing or other rallying, except by permit
- Solicitation or panhandling
- Feeding birds or squirrels
- Unauthorized motor vehicles, ATVs, or scooters
- Snorkels, fins, rafts, unauthorized watercraft, and other flotation devices
- Fishing, except in designated areas
- Bike riding or rollerblading
- No dogs on sand from May 1 to October 1. Dogs are permitted on the promenade 7a.m. to 10a.m. only.

For your safety:

- Red flags indicate that the beach is closed to swimming and bathing
- Swimmers must comply with lifeguard instructions
- Swimming and bathing only when lifeguard is on duty
- Lifeguards on duty 10 a.m. -6 p.m. (Memorial Day-Labor Day)
- Visitors must be off beach from 9 p.m. -6 a.m. daily
- Manhattan Beach Park closed 9 p.m.-6 a.m.
